

The Indigenous Careers Award is designed to encourage Indigenous Albertans (First Nations, Métis, and Inuit) to pursue and complete post-secondary studies in certificate, diploma, applied degree, and bachelor's degree programs.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>You must be Status Indian/First Nations, Non-Status Indian/First Nations, Métis, or Inuit and be able to provide proof of Indigenous ancestry.</li> <li>You must be a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident of Canada and an Alberta resident.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>You must apply to the school you are attending.</li> <li>If you are a co-op student, a student in a brokered program, or participating in an official exchange, you must apply through the school that will issue your post-secondary credential.</li> </ul>
Eligible School Requirement	Other Eligibility Criteria (if required)
<p>You must be attending a participating:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>public post-secondary school in Alberta, or</li> <li>First Nations College in Alberta</li> </ul>	
Course Load and Study Requirements	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>You must be enrolled in the 2023-24 Fall and/or Winter term in order to be considered for this award. Students enrolled in both terms are eligible for \$2,000 per term for a total of \$4,000. Students enrolled in only the Fall or the Winter term are eligible for \$2,000. A term is defined as a study period of up to 17 weeks in length.</li> <li>You must be enrolled in at least 60% of a full course load.</li> <li>If you are a student with a documented permanent disability, you can be eligible if you are enrolled in at least 40% of a full course load.</li> <li>Your school determines what constitutes a full-time course load in each program.</li> <li>Co-op students, students in brokered programs, and students who are participating in an official exchange may be eligible.</li> <li>You must be in satisfactory academic standing as determined by your school - satisfactory academic standing may vary in how it is determined by school or program.</li> <li>You are not eligible to receive the award if you withdraw from studies or drop from full-time to part-time studies before the award is paid.</li> </ul>	
Credential Types	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>You must be enrolled in a certificate, diploma, applied or bachelor's degree program. Students enrolled in apprenticeship technical training, integrated training, pre-employment or non-credential programs are not eligible.</li> </ul>

**Documentation Requirements:** If this is your first time applying for this award, you must provide proof of your Indigenous ancestry to your school to determine your eligibility. Acceptable documents of proof include:

- certificate of Indian Status, a status card or a valid band membership card
- letter from your band verifying your status
- membership card issued by a Métis organization the student is registered with (Métis organization must be a legal entity)
- a certified copy of a Nunavut Trust Certificate card or Inuit beneficiary card
- letter of support from Indigenous and Northern Affairs Canada or Nunavut Tunngavik Incorporated
- letter of support from a First Nation, Métis or Inuit organization (must be a legal entity) confirming the applicant's aboriginal ancestry

Schools may use discretion and accept other documentation.
